GHHS Cold Case: Society's Showcase Sparks Student Interest



What's happened to the large wooden showcase filled with Grandview Heights and Marble Cliff history which adorned the school's main hallway for many years? It's been relocated to the high school's second-floor study area, marking the inception of a new student project.

GHHS students

Keelyn Stackhouse (above left) and Maura Yates (above right) recognized that many students were unaware of the history of our two communities. With the assistance of GHHS faculty Marc Alter (Explore Program Director), Society archivists Debbie Farynowski and Jill Kuyper, and Trustee Emeritus Tom DeMaria, the two students intend to showcase people, events, and decisions that have helped shape our communities. Their first display highlights the history of Grandview Heights High School.

Keelyn, an 11th grader, reflects, "This **project is interesting to me because** I get to learn new facts about the city that I didn't know before. It's like story time when Maura and I discover all of these surprising and fun facts about Grandview Heights." She emphasizes the importance of sharing the city's history with her peers, ensuring it isn't forgotten.

Maura, a 9th grader, shares Keelyn's sentiment,

expressing, "I was interested in this project because I love history, but didn't know much about Grandview Height's history. Throughout this project I have just scratched the surface of the stories that go along with our town." Together, the students' goal is to help fellow students realize the part history plays in the creation of a community.



During the process, Maura invited University Archivist for The Ohio State University (and Grandview Heights parent) Tamar Chute to meet with the group, to give feedback and advice on how to refine the display (photo above right).

A *Moment In Time* Revisited Supporting the Community and Beyond



These **GHHS senior girls** were photographed after volunteering to process gas ration booklets during WWII, and were featured in the **September 19, 1944 edition** of the Columbus Dispatch. Pictured are (front left to right) Peggy Gammill, Shirley Close, Angela McGrath, and Pat Donovan, and (back) Shirley Ann Arthur, Judy Cash, and Ann Devlin. Unbeknownst to these students the picture and their home addresses were

also published in the Columbus Dispatch Service Edition, which was mailed to combat troops from Franklin County. All of the young **women received a deluge of letters** from soldiers, sailors, and marines from all over the world. None of the letters reportedly contained any marriage proposals. However, Judy Cash received the official title of "Dream Girl of the 163rd Company", a company of seamen from the Great Lakes Naval Training Center in Illinois.

Grandview Heights Public Library Celebrates 100 Years

The Grandview Heights Public Library (GHPL) celebrates 100 years of serving the community in 2024!

In June 1924, the library opened their doors in a room in the Grandview Heights



High School. After moving to four different rented sites on First Avenue, the library moved to the present location in September 1936. The original building (shown above) was built with WPA funds on land donated by George Cambridge Urlin, one of the founding fathers of Grandview Heights. To commemorate this milestone birthday, the library will be kicking off the 38th Annual Music on the Lawn summer concert series with the dedication of a **new permanent outdoor pavilion** and **site improvements** to their east lawn, drive-thru, parking, and pedestrian pathways.

Want to learn more about Grandview Heights and Marble Cliff and help preserve our communities' heritage and desirability?


Responsibilities of a Trustee include:
